FOREWORD BY RYAN TSENG, CEO

Welcome to Shield AI and a great adventure! It has demonstrated significant real-world impact across every numbered fleet, notably aiding in the interdiction of billions of dollars' worth of drugs within the U.S. Southern Command area of responsibility.

Another successful interdiction on 19 Oct 23 enabled by V-BAT and several of SAI finest Pilots! V-Bat got eyes on and observed possible illicit packets onboard the TOI. V-Bat provided real time bloodhound track via WinTak/Atak using the sensors point of interest and target creation with dead reckoning. Partner Nation successfully interdicted TOI (go-fast), confirmed illicit drugs onboard (cocaine), and 3 male pax apprehended. Outstanding Teamwork guys!

Historic firsts




First fully Al-piloted drone to be deployed in combat (2018)

We pioneered autonomous battlefield capabilities with our Nova quadcopter, the first aircraft to be equipped with our Hivemind technology. It was first deployed in 2018 with special operators in the Middle East and has since excelled in GPS-and-communications-denied environments, both indoors and underground. Supported by the Defense Innovation Unit and leading private investors, we tackled one of the toughest challenges first: autonomous indoor exploration in dangerous and dynamic combat environments. First tail-sitting vertical takeoff and landing drone to be operationally deployed (2019)

In 2019, we set a new standard in aviation with V-BAT, the first tail-sitting vertical takeoff and landing (VTOL) drone to be operationally deployed. V-BAT distinguishes itself with a patented ducted fan design that increases thrust by over 80% at equivalent engine power. This innovation allows for a single power plant operation, superior payload capacity, and extended flight duration – up to half a day or prolonged hovering. Its thrust vectoring technology ensures exceptional stability in harsh weather, while the safety-enhancing duct design eliminates the need for operator safety zones, broadening tactical possibilities.





Chosen by the U.S. and allied militaries for its unmatched performance and reliability, V-BAT stands out not just for its capabilities but as the pinnacle of aircraft design.



First real-world, Al-piloted air combat flights (2023)

In 2023, Shield AI dramatically advanced aviation history as part of the DARPA ACE Team. Our Hivemind technology, previously victorious in the DARPA AlphaDogFight, autonomously piloted an F-16 at the Air Force Test Pilot School in Edwards Air Force Base, California. This showcase of sophisticated autonomous combat maneuvers earned us a nomination for the prestigious Collier Trophy, celebrating exceptional achievements in aviation and astronautics. In 2024, Shield AI reached new heights when Secretary of the Air Force, Frank Kendall, personally experienced our AI pilot's capabilities by flying in the autonomously controlled F-16. First dual AI pilot, fourship, jet aircraft flights in national airspace (2024)

In 2024, Shield AI achieved another historic first with the successful execution of dual AI pilot, four-ship jet aircraft flights in national airspace. These high-performance, jet-powered drones autonomously conducted formation flying and tactical maneuvers, setting a groundbreaking precedent for blended operations between crewed and uncrewed aircraft. This advancement is pivotal for the future of air combat, emphasizing the seamless collaboration between autonomous systems and human pilots, vital for next-generation aerial warfare.





When you have two unmanned jet aircraft flying at 300-plus miles-per-hour with two manned jets in a very tight, restricted environment in terms of airspace, trust in your AI wingman takes on a whole new meaning.

Do what honor dictates.

As I tell those who do their onboarding session with me on values, I often get asked by investors and colleagues, "why is Shield AI so successful?"... "Is it the tech?" "Is it a key individual?".... I explain the #1 reason by far why Shield AI is so successful is because of a common mission and a shared set of aligned values. Ryan has asked me to share where our 'Do What Honor Dictates' value comes from and what it means to me.

The phrase "Do What Honor Dictates" comes from my 1st Phase BUD/S Instructor, Matty R. In the SEAL Teams, the 1st Phase instructors are the guardians and gatekeepers of the SEAL community (like our People Experience Team and every hiring manager are to Shield AI). They are hand-picked for the role and tasked with making sure that only those who exemplify the values and qualities embodied in the SEAL ethos make it through. Matty, or as we called him at the time, 'Instructor R,' is the epitome of a warrior and one of the most respected warriors in the SEAL community.

To give you a sense of Instructor R, he is an intimidating human being. He's strong, stern, and stoic. If you didn't know him, you would never want to casually strike up a conversation with him at the bar.

At the end of the first day of 1st Phase, Instructor R told us if we make it through Hell Week, he would share the story of the battle where he "got this nasty scar on my elbow", of which many of us had heard rumors of.

Five weeks later our class finished Hell Week, and true to his word, Instructor R sat us down late one evening, poured himself a tall glass of whiskey, and shared in detail how he and his SEAL Platoon were on a mission in Falluiah in 2007 and came under heavy enemy machine gun fire. Instructor R, the Platoon's medic, and their Platoon Commander were shot. The medic was closest to him, then his Platoon Commander, who had been shot in the face (Google "Jason Redman sign" for inspiration). Instructor R, though wounded, moved to try and help his two teammates (the medic and Platoon Commander), but immediately his left arm was shot. He looked down and thought it had been severed by the bullet. Later he would learn his arm was hanging by a single tendon, and that the force had flung the dangling portion of his arm behind his back so he couldn't see it. With his uninjured arm, he grabbed his teammate and dragged him while he returned fire with his pistol.

The story continued, but at the end of the battle, he described how he was fading into darkness on the MEDEVAC helicopter. Miraculously, he survived. For his actions that day, Instructor R was awarded the Silver Star (the 3rd highest combat decoration); he was also nominated for the Medal of Honor (he did not receive this award). Decorated SEALs who were there have described it as "the bravest thing I've seen in 17 years (as a SEAL) happened on that night. I watched Matty run forward, after he had already been shot and grab our Corpsman and drag him back....and he gets shot again, boom, spins arounds and dumps him, gets back up, and gets shot again."

At the end of the story, one of my BUD/S classmates raised their hand and asked him, "what was going through your head when you moved to help your teammates?"

Instructor R replied, "Do what honor dictates. What I wanted – or what was best for me – didn't matter. Even if it meant I would die. Honor dictated that I go help my teammates. When you recognize that honor is real... that an honorable life is real... even in the worst conditions, the decision-making... the life you choose to live... what you choose to do... becomes straightforward and clear. I hope you all remember that and take it with you to your SEAL Platoons and in life. The world needs more honorable people."

To me, 'Do What Honor Dictates' is about pursuing an honorable life – a life where we strive to do what is right day in and day out, live with integrity, and pursue a meaningful purpose, work, and positive impact. A life my friends and family will be proud that I pursued. It's a reminder that there are virtues more important than oneself, and that each day offers an opportunity to become the best version of ourselves. Additionally, it reminds us that while there are many ways to conduct ourselves, we choose to act in a manner that is moral, good, and of high standards – leaving the world better than we found it, simply because it's the right thing to do.

Every person at Shield AI is here because in some way they exemplify this value. You all should be incredibly proud of that because it is noble and honorable. I encourage you all to live this value and bring it to your teams, to Shield AI, every day.

In a military career of forty years, I had the privilege of serving in 26 different assignments and even more unique positions as both a leader and a servant. In fact, all of them required me to meet the objectives of both at the same time, and my time at Shield AI is no different. My military career included a wide array of roles across various ranks, departments, agencies, joint operations, and political administrations. In each and every one of these roles I learned so much from those I worked for, and even more from those I worked with.

The single greatest enabler in the performance of all those organizations and missions was a clear and concise understanding of our goals and objectives, with a focus on empowering the team and each member to do their job. As my father always told me, "You will not be remembered for what you did, you will be remembered by others for what you did for them." DRIVE

We value those whose commitment to mission, excellence, team, personal growth, and competitive spirit drives them to seek out and take on the hardest challenges facing the business. Our greatest teammates own their destiny and never consider themselves victims of circumstance because, with tenacity and unrelenting effort, they know – and have proven – that they can achieve anything.

INTELLECT

We value people who learn insanely fast because of their intellect, intuition, and grasp of first principles. Great teammates have a knack for focusing on the most important problems and then asking the right questions about the problems and themselves. They use rapid learning, rigorous scientific process, teamwork, and smart decision-making to swiftly, efficiently, and effectively drive progress.

TRACK RECORD OF EXCELLENCE

Continuation of past exceptional performance is an order of magnitude more likely than sudden improvement. We value teammates with a proven history of delivering exceptional results consistently over time. Their past achievements are a testament to their capability, dedication, and resilience, and their knowledge of "what right looks like" elevates the entire team.

ROCKETSHIP TRAJECTORY

We value those who are on a steep, upward trajectory in their professional and personal growth. Our people are consistently pushing the boundaries of their potential, seeking new challenges, and expanding their impact. In December 2016, co-founder Brandon Tseng wrote a letter to the company that remains as relevant today as it was then.

TO THE SHIELD AI TEAM:

I wanted to take a moment to thank all of you for your incredible work, energy, and determination this past year and also to share some thoughts about the year ahead. What you are doing is very difficult and despite the overwhelming number of technical challenges you face day to day, you have made incredible progress this past year towards building a game-changing capability that will have an immediate impact for our service members and the civilians stuck in the conflict areas our service members operate in.

2017 is going to be an exciting year for Shield; we will finish our 1st product, we will grow, and we will continue to dominate.

At the same time, 2017 will present its own set of challenges, and to overcome these challenges, we have to be great. That's why I wanted to share with you the most important lessons, ideas, and ideals I took away from my time in the SEAL Teams. It's a mindset I try to approach all challenges with. I think they are very applicable to living life if you want to be great ... regardless of whether you are a SEAL...and I wanted to share them with all of you because, if you're at Shield, you clearly want to be great. These ideals are very difficult to live up to, I have fallen short many times. The important thing is to recognize when you fall short and adjust course accordingly.

- If you choose to do anything, dominate it, crush it, give it your everything; anything worth doing, is worth doing 100%.
- 2. Lead by example, follow by example, everybody is always watching, always judging... your reputation is everything. Be known as intelligent, hard-working, reliable, and someone who gets things done no matter what. You're only as good as your last performance, you earn your spot on the Team every single day, you earn your reputation every single day.
- Take ownership of tasks no one wants or are difficult. Learn to love difficult things. Take pride in your work. The only easy day was yesterday.
- 4. Details distinguish professionals from amateurs.
- 5. There are no good excuses for failing or falling short. There is no such thing as a good excuse. Find a way to win. Every time. Mission success is the expectation.
- Become an expert in your domain. Expertise leads to confidence; confidence is critical to success.
- 7. Ask for help when you need it,

that's what teammates are for. Ask questions when things are unclear.

- Focus on success, plan for contingencies, not failure. There is a saying in skydiving: "Look towards the field and you'll land in the field, look at the trees and you'll land in the trees." Don't land in the trees.
- Positive attitudes are contagious, no one likes to work with people who are negative. Attitude is everything. Relentless energy is required to win. It's what distinguishes champions from those who are very good.
- 10. The best only want to be led by the best. The best will only follow the best. The best only want to work with the best.
- Every day is an opportunity to become better at what you do. Seek out brutally honest feedback to improve and give brutally honest feedback to improve others. Don't be offended by honest feedback. Feedback isn't something that happens once a year, make it a habit, make it regular.
- Rehearse, rehearse, rehearse. Rehearsing is preparation. Preparation leads to professionalism. Professionalism leads to credibility. Credibility leads to opportunity.

- You are more capable than you can imagine. You can push yourself to do things others can't or won't... if you choose to.
- When you concern yourself with the well-being of the team, the team will concern itself with the well-being of you. Your actions should serve the team.
- Sometimes the obvious isn't obvious. Speak up, it could be the difference between success and failure.
- 16. If your life is not in danger, life is pretty good.
- 17. Do what honor dictates.
- You will get knocked down more times than you can imagine. Get back up. When in doubt, just keep moving forward, one step at a time. Never quit.

In the SEAL Teams, there is no greater honor than to be recognized as a Teammate. I am so honored, humbled, and thankful to be part of the Shield AI Team; you all have been and continue to be incredible Teammates.
